Information

Dance is available in the curriculum up to Year 10 and at SACE 1 & 2 level.

Academically and technically accomplished students may have the opportunity to be accelerated through the dance program by completing SACE 1 Dance in Year 10 and SACE 2 Dance in Year 11.

The Co-curricular Dance@Scotch program is also scheduled outside of normal school hours.

1. Dance Curriculum: Years 8, 9 & 10

Students who elect to study dance as a subject will attend Dance classes during their elective subject choices.

For Years 8 and 9 one Contemporary class is compulsory. Students are entitled to attend as many practical classes as they wish, over and above this minimum requirement. Students must also attend a minimum of one Contemporary Dance class within the Dance@Scotch program.

Students are assessed on technique, composition, performance and theory.

2. Dance Curriculum: SACE Dance

SACE students must attend all scheduled classes within their College timetable.

In addition, all SACE students must attend a minimum of one Classical and one Contemporary class as a part of the Dance@Scotch Program. They are entitled to attend as many classes as they wish, over and above this minimum requirement.

They must also attend rehearsals during school holidays and weekends as required in preparation for Assessment Tasks and moderation performances.

Students are assessed on skills development, composition, performance and a response.

3. Casual Dance

Students can also enroll in the Dance@Scotch program as a Casual dancer. Students can choose from Jazz, Tap, Hip Hop, Ballet and Contemporary and are included in various performance opportunities throughout the year.

Dance@Scotch classes are a co-curricular offering from Prep - Year 12. These classes are streamed to support individual student development and wellbeing. Classes on offer include Jazz, Tap, Hip Hop, Ballet and Contemporary. All classes are taught by our experienced and diverse dance Faculty.

Student Guidelines & Expectations

All students who undertake dance tuition, and their parents/guardians, are required to read and abide by the Dance Tuition: Student Guidelines & Expectations prior to commencement of classes.

Forms to Complete

Parents should complete the Application for Dance Tuition online via their Operoo profile.

Once received, they will be advised to attend a 'Come & Try' session so the HoD can assign them a class according to their level of experience.
