Results at a glance for the 2021 cohort:

- 48 students with an ATAR of 90 or above
- 32 students achieved a score of 95 or above
- 3 students with a score over 99
- 39 Merits across 19 subjects, of these 19 were achieved by Year 11 students
- 100% SACE completion

We would like to congratulate our Dux of the College for 2021 Rujinyi (Ruby) Chen with an outstanding ATAR of 99.65. Ruby has lived in Rosevear Boarding since moving from Henan Province in northern China 5 years ago. She is proud of her results and has enjoyed working with the teachers and the supportive relationships that she has experienced both in boarding and in the classroom. Her favourite subject was Specialist Mathematics for which she received a Merit "I really enjoyed all units of work, but complex numbers is really interesting!" This means she is an abstract thinker who loves working across integrated algebraic and geometrical concepts with the seemingly intangible ideas of imaginary numbers. Ruby is intending to study a Bachelor of Medical Bioscience at the University of Melbourne with the hope of becoming a surgeon.

# Year 11

In the subject Research Project 73 of our students achieved in the A grade band.

In all 82 Year 11 students studying a Stage 2 subject achieved in the A grade band (61%). This bodes well for next year, which promises to be another high performing cohort.


