Pathways after school

Higher Education Sector

- •University Courses
- •Requires completion of Year 12 & required TER
- •May have additional entrance requirements (UCAT, portfolio of work, audition, interview, prerequisites, etc)

VET/TAFE Sector

- Vocational Skills and TAFE courses (Cert II, Cert III, Cert IV, Diploma, Advanced Diploma)
- Can lead into uni courses (eg Bachelor degree)
- Range of entrance requirements

The Workforce

- Requires getting a job (application, interview, etc)
- Straight into earning money
- May require on the job training





Australian Tertiary Admission Rank

- Measure of a student's overall achievement compared to others in Australia
- Used by universities in the selection of school leavers for a place in university courses in Australia and overseas
- Ranges from 0 99.95
- Queensland uses slightly different system (your ATAR is automatically converted when you apply)
- Lasts for a number of years (until you have completed 2 full years of university study)





How is the ATAR calculated?

- 1. Your top 4¹/₂ scaled subjects become an aggregate out of 90
- 2. Your maximum result is automatically generated
- 3. Your Aggregate is converted into an ATAR

Calculating an ATAR

EXAMPLE #1: A student receives the following scaled scores.

University Aggregate =

(Score from best 90 credits)

82.80 (Bio, Chem, Gen Maths, PE, ½ Psych)

ATAR (based on 2021 conversion)

≈ 96.55





Calculating an ATAR

EXAMPLE #2: A student receives the following scaled scores.

62.40

(Score from best 90 credits)

ATAR (based on 2021 conversion)

≈ 71.00

What are they?

- Also called "Adjustment Factors"
- Apply to South Australian & NT public universities
- Different systems of bonus points also apply interstate
- In SA, maximum of 9, split into 2 categories
- Added to your Aggregate, then recalculated in TER

2 categories

- 1. SA Universities Equity Scheme (max 5 points)
- 2. SA Language, Literacy & Mathematics Bonus Scheme (max 4 points)



SA Adjustment Factors (Bonus points)

- 1. SA Universities Equity Scheme
- 5 points added to Aggregate, then recalculated TER
- All students in certain schools (geographical, level of uni representation, mean ATAR)
- Individuals in all schools (personal financial situation AUSTUDY, ABSTUDY, School Card, Health Care Card, etc)
- Apply for ALL university courses (including Medicine and Veterinary Bioscience)
- Proof of eligibility required (via document upload in SATAC application)





Adjustment Factors (Bonus points)

2. SA Language, Literacy & Mathematics Bonus Scheme

- Max 4 points added to Aggregate, then recalculated TER
- 2 per subject (Specialist Mathematics, Maths Methods, English Studies, English, LOTE)
- Must get a C- or better
- Does NOT apply for Medicine or Veterinary Bioscience





Bonus Points – ATAR example revisited

EXAMPLE #2: A student receives the following scaled scores.

	Physics	English Literary Studies	Maths Methods	Biology	Research Project B
Scaled Score	16.2 (A-)	14.8 (B)	12.4 (C)	10.2 (C)	8.8 (A)
Used in Uni Agg Score	Yes	Yes	Yes	Yes	Yes

University Aggregate = 62.40

(Score from best 90 credits)

ATAR (based on 2021) ≈ **71.00**

Revised SA Uni Aggregate = 66.40 (includes 4 bonus points) Revised Tertiary Entrance Rank (TER) = 76.60





Adjustment Factors- FAQ

- Do they show up on my SACE Certificate/Notification of results?
 No
- Do I have to do anything for the "subject" bonus points to be added?
 No
- Do I need to do anything for the "equity" bonus points to be added?

Yes, through your SATAC (also VTAC, UAC etc) application. Check each website carefully.

• How do I know what my revised Tertiary Entrance Rank is? Ring each university you have applied for after you have received your ATAR and ask.





TER/Selection Rank Cutoffs

• What they are?

Lowest TER from previous year that received an offer into that course (they therefore include adjustment factors). Domestic students and International students have slightly different TER cutoffs

• Do they change over time?

Supply and demand... but generally very similar from year to year unless courses change

What about "Guaranteed Entry"?

All 3 public universities in SA have "Guaranteed Entry" – not for all courses and often requires that course to be the applicant's top preference on their SATAC application. Assumes consistent patterns of course selection from year to year.

How do I find them?

University course information under "Entry Requirements" and on SATAC website course descriptions

Rural and remote subquota?

Applies in some high demand courses to help increase the participation of rural students. Doesn't add bonus points, it effectively employs a slightly lower cutoff rank for eligible students. All information is on university course websites.





How do uni applications work?

Online through each state's university admissions body.


Uni application timelines?

- Applications open all around Australia in the first week of August
- Can apply in all states simultaneously
- "Submit" by the "end" of September edit until January
- Check dates in all states carefully similar but some differences

Course Preferences

- Rank them in desired order, separate order for each state
- You can rearrange this order, delete courses and add new courses until listed closing dates
- Some courses have earlier closing dates (eg Med, Dentistry, Performing Arts, etc)
- TAFE SA courses are a separate application (so they don't count in these tallies)






Entry Pathways to University

Yr 11 Results Pathway – Adelaide University



- Early application date and conditional offers best 4 Yr 11 grades are used
- Normal application also advised
- Not available for all courses (<u>https://www.adelaide.edu.au/study/undergraduate/year11-entry-pathway#which-degrees-are-excluded</u>)

Entry Pathways to University

Uni SA – Grades Based Entry Pathway

- Best 3 TAS subjects can get you entry into a range of degrees
- Eg "A,A,B"

Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT)

- Not all universities accept STAT for school leavers, age requirements apply
- Not all courses offer STAT places https://www.satac.edu.au/stat

What is it?

A nationally recognised 2 hour, 70 question multiple choice online aptitude test

Typically....

For Semester 1 entry:

- In South Australia you must be at least 18 years of age before 1 February in the year of entry to the course.
- For Charles Darwin University the minimum age for special entry applicants is 19 years before 1 January in the year of uni entry.

For Semester 2 entry:

- In South Australia you must be at least 18 years of age before 1 July in the year of entry to the course.
- For Charles Darwin University the minimum age for special entry applicants is 19 years before 1 July in the year of entry.
- **Cost** approx \$170 (MUST be booked & sat before required date for results to be included) Book at <u>https://stat.acer.org/au</u>





SA Entry Pathways to University (cont)

Uni TEST (Flinders University)

- 2 ¹/₂ hour test administered by ACER. Not applicable to all Flinders University degrees.
- 60% ATAR and 40% uniTest OR 100% uniTest (whichever is better for the student)

Accommodation

- Listed on each university website
- Range of options and prices
- Aimed at different clientele (eg single sex, religious, academic, etc)
- Scholarships may be available
- Typically tours at the university open days (August/Sept check each uni website for details)
- Applications processing fee
- Timeline usually open for Sem 1 applications after Open Day weekend (in August)
- Advice research and prepare application early, then you are set to go after a tour just before applications open
- Ring the universities directly with specific queries

Timeline



- •University applications open (usually 1st Monday in August, TBC)
- •Distribution of SATAC guides and lunchtime application help sessions (SA & interstate)
- •University open days (virtual and in-person)
- •Checkout interstate open days and deadlines (usually very similar dates to SA)

Term 4

- •Finalise university applications (typically also able to occur after ATARs released)
- •Typically, approx. 16th December ATARs released

Mid-January 2022 – Main rounds of university offers around Australia
