We are delighted to announce that Keagan Wallace has also received a Governor of South Australia Commendation Excellence Award for 2023. The Governor of South Australia Commendation acknowledges and celebrates overall excellence in the South Australian Certificate of Education. It recognises excellent achievement in Year 12 subjects as well as success in developing the SACE capabilities of Literacy, Numeracy, Information and Technology Capability, Creative and Critical Thinking, Personal and Social Capability, Ethical Understanding and Intercultural Understanding.

Our approach to learning is to provide a purposeful, caring, inspirational and well-resourced offering which enables enrichment beyond exam results. We have formed partnerships and designed approaches which have enabled our students to learn how to be effective researchers in the Research Project and Activating Identities and Futures where 84 students were in the A band. Our students chose diverse topics including: Genetic Disposition and Polycystic Ovary Syndrome, SARS-Cov2 Virus Impact on Mitochondria used to Treat Long COVID, Chinese Animation and Current Society, Cereal Cropping in the Yorke Peninsula, Finland and Sweden's push to join NATO, Nunga Court – Advantages and Disadvantages, The Cashless Debit Card in Regional SA, which broadened their intellectual horizons and nurtured their curiosity.

Results at a glance for the 2023 cohort:

- 63 students with an ATAR of 90 or above
- 35 students achieved a score of 95 or above
- 7 students with a score over 99
- 32 Merits across 17 subjects, of these 8 were achieved by Year 11 students
- 54.22% of students received at least an A grade


